PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

St Michael and All Angels' Church Garden

The Climate and Nature Group gardeners have started to work in the church garden with the intention of making it more accessible, more attractive and more supportive to wildlife.

A simple path around the sides of the church is being constructed and there will eventually be a holly hedge at the rear boundary. Much of the ground is covered by ivy and unwanted saplings from the horse chestnut trees. The saplings will be removed and some of the ivy will be replaced by clumps of native wildflower species such as bluebells, daffodils and snowdrops.

Some trimming of the lower branches of the mature trees has been authorized and this will allow more light into the garden.

To support the hedgehogs that frequent the garden, two predator-proof hedgehog shelters (pictured below), have been placed in the church garden. Middleton hedgehogs seem to be thriving this year. There have been numerous sightings and visits to local gardens across the parish. Finance from District Councillor Laura Mellstrom's Local Project Fund paid for the shelters. New warning signs for motorists have been put up to alert them about hedgehogs crossing the roads.



The Memorial Trees

The beech tree to mark the platinum jubilee of the late Queen Elizabeth II, and the crab apple tree to mark the occasion of King Charles III's coronation are growing well in their positions along the path towards Bateman's Tomb. Both trees had become partly obscured by overgrown vegetation which has now been cleared. Commemorative plaques are planned for both trees.

The Community Greenhouse behind the Village Hall is being fully used. The site now has a rainwater harvester in addition to the two water butts. There are plans to create composting bays at the rear of the site once all the remaining debris is removed.

Thanks to Mr Mark Sealey for the donation of the rainwater harvester and to the Climate and Nature group gardeners for all their regular work in keeping the public, planted areas in the village looking so attractive.
